Field Action Projects: The faculty centre has already started a joint venture with Development Research Communication & Services Centre (DRCSC), a Kolkata-based NGO; although the members have felt a need for systematic mechanism for the same.

# B. Admission to the ongoing courses

The admission of students to MSc in Agricultural Biotechnology (AgBT) and MSc/M.A. in Agriculture and Rural Development (ARD)/Integrated Rural Development and Management (IRDM) courses for the academic session 2013-14 was held on 9 June 2013. List of candidates selected for interview, based on their performance in the written test, was published on 12 June, 2013, and was subsequently interviewed on 13 June 2013. New batches of students for the Academic Period 2013-15 were then admitted to the MSc/MA in ARD/IRDM and MSc in AgBT courses. During this year, 102 and 78 applications were received for the above-mentioned courses, of which 99 and 64 students appeared in the admission test respectively. Ultimately, 21 students in MSc/MA in ARD/IRDM course and 20 students for MSc in AgBT course were admitted.

The meeting started with the chanting of Universal Vedic prayer followed by reading from the selected passage of the complete works of Swami Vivekananda. Swami Atmapriyananda took the Chair.

Renaming the M.Sc (Agriculture and Rural Development) course: In an effort to
attract students who want to pursue management and also to increase national
acceptability of the course, members present suggested that a new name of the course."
 M.Sc in Agriculture. Rural Development and Management" can be considered

- Popularization of M. Sc (Agriculture and Rural Development) course: It was augusted that to popularize M.Sc (Agriculture and Rural Development) course, online the invited to come over as a jury which will further increase the popularity. Members also augusted campaigning throughout the year, organizing workshops, NGO meet, circulation of magazines like Krishaka Debo Bhava, and proper documentation.
- Uniformity of course credit hours: It was advised that to maintain the unity of course wredit system throughout the university system 1 credit should be considered equivalent to 18 hours starting from the 2014-15 academic session.
- Guidelines for new courses: It was decided that three new courses will be started at the faculty centre using available infrastructures and/or as per the requirement of UGC. These courses are Masters in Social Work (MSW), M.Sc in Post Harvest Technology, and a certificate course on Ayurveda and Neutraceuticles. Some members also suggested using the title of "pro-biotic food" for the new Ayurveda certificate course. It was decided that for the certificate course the minimum eligibility criteria should be 10+2 (science) with age no bar. The total intake will be 25 while the medium of instruction will be English. Course coordinator Dr. Chhanda Mandal has emphasized that some basic research will be blended with the course for possible AYUSH funding. The house profusely thanks to Dr. Mandal for her initiative. For MSW curse, the members advised the requirement for at least two new faculties. Members also suggested to initiate M.Sc in Agri-marketing and advised inclusion of value chain in the course curricula.

Agenda 3. Progress regarding the four courses running at the Narendrapur Faculty Centre, namely, (i) M.Sc. in 'Integrated Rural Development and Management (IRDM)'; (ii) M.Sc. in 'Agricultural Biotechnology (AgBT)'; (iii) PhD in 'Integrated Rural Development and Management (IRDM)'; and (iv) PhD in 'Agricultural Biotechnology (AgBT)'

A one-day seminar on Food Security and Sustainable Agriculture was organized by Rumakrishna Mission Vivekananda University (RKMVU) in collaboration with State Agricultural Management and Extension Training Institute (SAMETI-West Bengal), Itallygunge Society for Environment and Development (BSED), and Sasya Shyamala Krishi Vigyan Kendra under RKMVU on 2<sup>nd</sup> March, 2014 at the Faculty Centre. Humarahle Vice Chancellar of RKMVU, revered Swami Atmapriyananda gave welcome

address and spoke about the 'Anna Brhma Upasana' mentioned in the Vedas and the importance of food in all the phases of human life. Dr. S. Ayappan, Director General, Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) & Secretary, Department of Agricultural Research and Education, Ministry of Agriculture, Govt. of India, in his inaugural address, discussed the challenges of food security and sustainable agriculture in India and emphasized the need of improved mechanizations and adoption of scientific approaches to feed the huge Indian population. He also mentioned the need of attracting best students to agriculture and drew attention to the increasing number of female students taking to agricultural courses. Shri Pradip Mazumdar, Agricultural Advisor to the Hon'ble Chief Minister of West Bengal, in his special address, emphasized the steps taken by the Department of Agriculture, Govt. of West Bengal to encourage export of different rice varieties (especially the non basmati scented rice 'Tulaipanji') and arrangement of large scale procurement of paddy directly from the farmers to prevent distress sale. Professor Chittaranjan Koley, Vice-Chancellor, Bidhan Chandra Krishi Viswavidyalaya discussed the biotechnological perspective of food security and sustainable agriculture. He deliberated on several biotechnological advancements developed by his research team to mitigate human health problems. He also mentioned different biotechnological aspects such as eisgenics, nanobiotechnology to improve crop yield and quality. Dr. S. Ramarethinam, President R&D, T. Stanes and Co. Ltd discussed the role of agro input industries in food security and sustainable agriculture. He emphasized several practical challenges faced by the private sector while providing the essential inputs for the progress of Indian agriculture. Revered Swami Sarvagananda, Secretary, Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama, Narendrapur and Administrative head of the IRDM Faculty Centre. delivered the valedictory address emphasizing the food and its contribution towards human civilization. Apart from the students, faculty and monks of RKMVU, many scientists from ICAR institutes, representatives from agro input industries, NGOs, teachers and students from different institutes and universities participated in the seminar.
